She was born on 17th January 1965. Rosa García received a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics from the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid. She has more than thirty years of international experience in the fields of Information Technology, Energy, Infrastructure, and Manufacturing.

Most of her career was spent at Microsoft. In 1991, she joined Microsoft Ibérica as Technical Support Director. Five years later, she moved to the company's headquarters in Redmond (USA) to work with the CEO, Steve Ballmer, as Director of Corporate Strategy. In 2000, as General Manager of the Worldwide Partner Group, she directed Microsoft's worldwide strategy for more than 640,000 independently owned-and-operated partner companies that support Microsoft and its customers in 170 countries. In May 2002, she returned to Spain to assume the maximum responsibility of Microsoft Ibérica as Executive President of the company managing a team of more than 750 professionals and generating annual revenue close to 700 Million Euros. Six years later, she was appointed Consumer & Online Vice-President for Western Europe. She was responsible for Microsoft's global advertising sales, all the marketing strategy, and execution across the Company's consumer products in WE. She managed more than 500 professionals in 14 countries and delivered more than 2 Billion US Dollars in revenue per year.

In 2011, she joined Siemens as Executive President in Spain, a position she held until December 2018. She managed a company with more than 3500 professionals and it delivered more than 3 Billion Euros in revenue annually. In addition, in April 2017, she was appointed Non-Executive Chairwoman of Siemens Gamesa immediately after the merger of Siemens Wind Power and Gamesa.
